Camping and Glamping at Cormiston Farm

We are not a campsite - and just have occasional camping for guests attending Spring and Summer Weddings for a limited number of days each year. Remember that it can snow in June and rain at any time, and you should come prepared for all weathers. It can be too sunny and too hot. Facilities are basic. It is a farm.

Our aim is to be as environmentally friendly as we can, with your help.

Camping or Glamping is by appointment only and in designated areas. All tents/equipment/electric hook-ups and camping pitches are limited in number and are allocated on a first come, first served basis.

Parking. There is a short walk to the pitch area and you cannot park by your tent. There is a designated parking area. All parking is at your own risk, and no responsibility can be accepted for damage or loss to vehicles while in the car park. On arrival you will be allocated your glamping or camping pitch.

Trolleys are available to help carry heavy baggage or tents. Please return these to the car park when you have unloaded.

Smoking is not permitted in the glamping tents. In the farmyard area, garden and barn, smoking is permitted only in the smoking area (by the main barn). Smoking is permitted on the front field, but extreme caution is required when disposing of cigarette ends to prevent fire and contamination, and they must not be dropped in the field, yard or garden.

No fires (except in designated fire pits/stoves) or by special permission. No disposable BBQs. If you do have permission for a fire-pit/brazier then it must be at least 2m from the glamping tent. (Internally fitted wood stoves are permitted in your own tent provided all manufacturers' instructions are followed)

Electricity The glamping tents have an electricity supply of a maximum of 13Amps. Do not overload the circuits of the electricity. Electricity supplied directly to camper vans/ caravans is 16Amps and should not be overloaded. All electricity supplied is from renewable sources.

Toilets and Washing Facilities

There are composting toilets near the camping/glamping area. These require all participants to sit down (rather than stand up) in order to correctly compost the waste. Sprinkle

a very small amount of sawdust into the composting part of the loo when you have finished.

There are flush toilets and washbasins with hot water in the barn, which is a longer walk. These empty to a bio-digester so do not put anything except loo paper down the toilets.

Small hand towels / paper towels are provided in the barn toilet facilities, but you will need to bring your own hand towels / bath towels for showers.

There are very limited shower facilities at the farm and we request that you keep your shower short. Even better try to stay clean, avoid the shower and save water and energy.

Rubbish

Although we do provide a limited number of bins etc we ask that you take your rubbish home with you. This is because you can then sort out what can be recycled/re-used and the recycling does not get mixed up and end up in land fill.

Please take everything you brought home with you and leave your camping pitch as you found it. Be especially careful not to leave pegs, glass etc as the field is used by sheep and horses.
